

BOXLEY'S GROUNDWATER PROTECTION PLAN

This plan will be implemented to provide additional security beyond the existing proffers and State programs in place to protect groundwater resources for well owners. In an effort to provide independent resolution to any well issues, Boxley will establish the following:

- Independent team of 3 people consisting of independent Hydrologist, Evington Community Leader, and Boxley team member will be selected to monitor and arbitrate ground water issues.
- Boxley will seek Campbell County guidance and recommendations on appropriate community leader from Evington
- Evington Leader and Boxley Team Member will pick Hydrologist
- Independent Escrow fund will be established with \$50,000 in fund for any fees regarding any well issue.
- The Escrow fund will increase every 5 years per the following schedule.
 - After 5 years \$75,000
 - After 10 years \$100,000
 - After 15 years \$150,000
 - After 20 years \$200,000After 20 years the Escrow will increase \$50,000 every 5 years
- Boxley will maintain the Escrow fund at the above levels.
- If neighbor has well issues that they think Boxley Flat Creek quarry caused, neighbor will submit complaint to independent team.
- If independent team determines that the Boxley Flat Creek Quarry has adversely affected the neighbors well, Boxley will hook neighbor up to county water line or drill a new well at the neighbor's choice. The county water line has to be within 400 feet of the property per CCUSA guidance.
- Monitor wells will be drilled and in place no later than 1 year after rezoning and conditional use permit approval
- Evington Community Leader and Boxley Team member will commence once a month monitoring immediately after monitor wells are established. Results will be published on public website

Boxley will have independent Hydrologist conduct an inventory of all wells within one mile radius of property lines of south parcel. Inventory will be completed before quarry operations begin. Neighbors must agree to participate in inventory to be eligible for program benefits.
